COUPLE COMMUNICATION - PEACEMAKERS

Introduction – The principles of couple communication I presented the preceding two weeks are applicable in every area of our lives. The rule of reciprocity is universally true.

Romans 12:18

A. We should start at home and work by being an active listener.

James 1:19-21

- 1. Be quick to clarify what others mean.
- 2. Recognize that others may not verbally express their true intentions in a clear way.
- 3. Do not jump to conclusions before making sure we know the reasons why they believe a specific thing.
- 4. The problem may be our selective listening.
- 5. If we feel angry about what another person says then we are only making a possible interpretation of it.
- 6. The greatest obstacle to people hearing one another may be what James calls moral filth.
- 7. Summarize what you are hearing until the other person agrees that you got it.
- B. We must recover the sacred nature of words in our daily conversations.

James 3:2-12

- 1. The control of our personal speech may be our greatest moral challenge.
- 2. We must be introspective and cleanse our attitudes before we speak a word.
- 3. The goal of our communication is not to convince others of their faults, but to reveal our perspective in a way it can be heard.
- 4. We must seek common ground and mutual understanding before we proceed to conflict resolution.

C. It takes godly wisdom to resolve differences among people.

James 3:13-18

- 1. Worldly wisdom is motivated by selfish ambition and envy and always results in chaos and evil behaviors and attitudes.
- 2. When we talk it should not be to correct, humiliate, or debate others because this leads to defensive and antagonistic responses.
- 3. Heavenly wisdom is characterized by humility, pure intentions, being considerate, full of mercy, impartial, and peace-loving.
- 4. You must create a peaceful environment for people to open up about their real wants.
- 5. Once each person feels heard by the other then you can proceed to a resolution of the issue.

<u>Conclusion</u> – We must be fully committed to becoming peacemakers in every avenue of our lives. We need to grow in godly wisdom to be effective peacekeepers.

James 1:5
